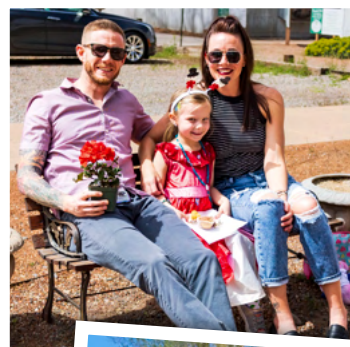

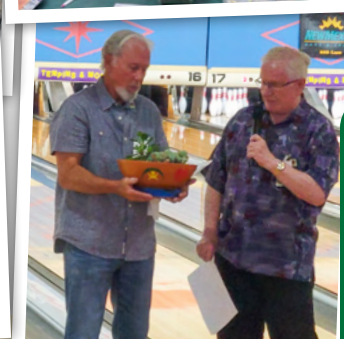

March is Brain Injury Awareness Month, dedicated to raising awareness about brain injuries and their impact on individuals, families and our community, along with strategies to improve the quality of life for survivors and their loved ones.

One is a three-person residential facility in Albuquerque's Northwest Quadrant and the second a ten-person intake facility in the South Valley. These new facilities provide a supportive and nurturing environment for people to regain maximum independence and quality of life following a brain injury. Local access to specialized, residential neuro rehab services, dedicated healthcare professionals and tailored treatment plans play a crucial role in improving outcomes for individuals affected by brain injuries and their families.
